

Scaling small

- 'This is great, but how does it scale?'
- Creating infrastructures that allow many presses to thrive at multiple scales
- More diverse and robust than one or two presses getting bigger
- Paving sturdy roads, not building bigger cars

The ScholarLed presses

- Open access book publishers
- Not-for-profit & academic-led
- Reject 'author-pays' to fund OA
- Over 500 books published
- Collaboration not competition

The COPIM Project

- Community-led Open Publication Infrastructures for Monographs
- An international partnership including the ScholarLed presses, universities, libraries,
 & infrastructure providers
- £2.2 million funding from Research England and £800,000 from Arcadia Fund
- Creating open, community-governed infrastructures to support OA book publishing
